COMMUNITY INFORMATION SESSIONS SUMMARY

The City is planning a new Drysdale library to service Drysdale, Clifton Springs, Curlewis and northern Bellarine Peninsula communities.

The City asked the community to have their say initially through a survey in 2020 to help to understand what the community valued about the current library service, and to ensure the City meets the communities needs for a contemporary library service. This survey helped to inform the design.

Throughout 2020 the City worked with the Wadawurrung and local community organisation's to develop a design to meet the needs of the local communities.

Two community information sessions were held at the Drysdale Senior Citizen Centre on 2 and 6 February 2021 providing the community an opportunity to view the design plans and ask questions regarding the project. The sessions were staff by City of Greater Geelong officers and architects from Antarctica Architects and Architects Associates.
