

ROAD MANAGEMENT PLAN REVIEW – MAY UPDATE



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

On 26 February 2021, the City commenced community engagement on the Municipal Road Management Plan Review.

When engaging on the draft plan, we asked the community to review the draft and provide their comments on the Plan:

- Inspection frequencies;
- Hazard intervention levels;
- Response times; and
- any additional comments they had.

In total we had 24 submissions. Nine comments related to inspection frequency, 12 to hazard intervention levels and five to response times. A further 15 comments were not directly related to the Plan and were passed on to relevant Departments for consideration and action. A number of comments related to concerns about specific roads or locations. These have been documented separately from the Plan. All submitters will be responded to individually.

We thank everyone for their contributions. The following minor changes have been made to the Plan based on community and stakeholder feedback and officer recommendations:

- Reduced response time frames for category 5 footpath repairs.
- Reduced hazard intervention levels for footpath potholes from 50mm to 30mm.
- Increased inspection frequency for kerb & channel assets.

The Plan was unanimously adopted by Council at their Ordinary Council Meeting on 25 May 2021.



NEXT STEPS

The review process is now officially closed, and the City has commenced operating in accordance with the updated plan as of 26 May 2021. Everyone who made a submission will be contacted in writing and provided with an update and a response to their submission.
