LEOPOLD PROACTIVE SAFETY PILOT



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

The City of Greater Geelong asked the community to have their say on how safe they felt along the Leopold section of the Bellarine Rail Trail.

The project was funded by the Victoria Government's Community Crime Prevention Program through the Department of Justice and Community Safety and included the installation of safety infrastructure at Gateway Sanctuary and numerous bus stops in Leopold.

Concerns shared with us about public use along the rail trail included the speed of cyclists on the trail, lack of awareness from users of shared use paths and concerns for lighting.

SAFETY INFRASTRUCTURE INSTALLATION THROUGH FUNDING FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY SAFETY.

As a result, the following has been installed across the Leopold section of rail trail, Gateway Sanctuary and selected bus shelters in the Leopold area as part of the Victoria Government's Community Crime Prevention Program through the Department of Justice and Community Safety.

Safety infrastructure additions include:

- 4 lights with CCTV on the rial trail and at Gateway Sanctuary
- 2 lights with people counters on the rail trail
- 4 lights with people counters at bus shelters
- 1 light with a CCTV at a bus shelter
- 2 bus shelters received improved lighting

Internal City departments have also installed signage on numerous sections of the Bellarine Rail Trail that will assist with education on etiquette for dual use paths.
