Portarlington Facilities Study - Summary

WHY DID WE UNDERTAKE THIS WORK?

The DRAFT Portarlington Community Infrastructure Scoping Study aims to holistically understand the facilities and services needed to meet the current and future needs of Portarlington.

This includes consideration of existing facilities in the town, to understand need for future upgrades and improvements, including the need for any future community hub.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Phase one community engagement was undertaken earlier in 2022 and resulted in:

WHAT WE FOUND

Portarlington is well serviced by the existing community facilities; no significant gaps in provision were found.

The town would benefit from the addition of a library lounge, an arts / exhibition space and Maternal and Child Health Services.

Upgrades are required to the existing suite of community facilities to improve functionality and accessibility, particularly Parks Hall.

It is likely that the construction of a brandnew purpose-built community hub would create under-utilisation of the existing facilities.

There is varied community and stakeholder sentiment on whether Portarlington needs a brand-new purpose-built community hub; some would like a 'one stop shop' and others seek improvements to the existing facilities.

The Study recognises the unique aggregation of facilities that exist within walking distance of town, the foreshore and each other.

It found that a range of physical and functional enhancements to existing facilities will provide increased community benefit.

> This includes improvements to Parks Hall.
